Section 3-HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW: Potential Health Effects: **Primary Entry Routes:** Eyes, skin, ingestion. **Target Organs:** Eyes, skin, gastrointestinal tract. **Acute Effects:** *Inhalation:* Not normally a problem. *Eye:* May cause irritation, redness and/or burning. *Skin:* May cause irritation, redness and/or burning. *Ingestion:* May be harmful if swallowed. Section 4-FIRST AID MEASURES

Wash affected area with mild soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists or develops. Section 5-FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Flash Point: NA. **Flammability Classification:** Non-flammable. **Extinguishing Media:** Water spray, dry chemical, carbon dioxide, or foam.

Unusual Fire or Explosion Hazards: Containers exposed to fire may rupture violently. Keep containers cool with water spray. **Hazardous Combustion Products:** Oxides of nitrogen and carbon. **Fire-Fighting Instructions:** Fire fighters should wear full protective equipment and self-contained breathing apparatus.
